### **PROGRAM**

#### **CFATS**

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has recently issued its Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standard (CFATS) that could impact a large number of facilities. One of the substances covered by CFATS is propane and the current threshold is 7,500 pounds. Although this threshold is expected to increase, facilities with large propane tanks (probably greater than 18,000 gallons) will have requirements under CFATS. This presentation will describe these requirements.

#### **Construction and Demolition**

The fastest growing component of Georgia's land-filled waste stream is from Construction and Demolition (C&D) activities. Every new construction, renovation, or demolition of a building - industrial, commercial or residential - creates significant amounts of waste. Come hear how businesses in Georgia are saving money and the environment through the reduction, recycling, and reuse of C&D waste.

#### **Biodiesel 102**

Come hear an update on Biodiesel in the State of Georgia: providing an overview of production, availability and use of Biodiesel in the State of Georgia. This includes basic background information on the production and use of the fuel and reviews the economic and agronomic obstacles facing the widespread use of the fuel in the Southeast.

#### **Emergency Response and OSHA Update**

Representatives from the Georgia Tech Research Institute's Safety and Health Consultation Programs will present an update on activity at OSHA, with a focus on emergency planning and emergency response regulations and interpretations.
